Social Media and Smartphones

The school's Chair of Governors, Stephen Hill has recently been involved in a police project concerning the threats to children

from both social media and smartphones and we wanted to share the following link with our parents from an Ofcom publication.

There has been a significant increase in children aged from 5 upwards now accessing a smartphone whether it belongs to them or their parent/carer which is raising some concern. This is ever more important when children are being allowed access to sites such as TikTok and become immersed in a false reality of what is happening in the world, upsetting videos, exposure to predators and even how to look, which we know impacts a child's self-esteem, body image and confidence.

Whilst we need to introduce children to technology and allow them access to all the exciting benefits it can offer, we should also be reminded of the greater safeguarding concerns this technology does bring. Evidence states that most recorded incidents stem from a lack of parental supervision/guidance and lack of understanding.
